Littering



- It is unlawful to transport household garbage from outside the city for collection inside the city.
- It is unlawful to place trash for collection by the city in any of the following areas:
- On any street, sidewalk, right of way, ditch, or storm drainage area or on another's private property
- 2. On a water meter box or manhole cover
- 3. Within five feet of a fire hydrant or utility pole or guy wire
- 4. In any place or area that is inaccessible to the mechanical loader used by the city
- 5. In any area which creates a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
- It is unlawful to place any item
 exceeding ten feet in length, garbage,
 or special waste for collection by the city.
- It is unlawful to intermingle boxes, empty containers, scrap wood, metal, fabrics, furniture, appliances, electronics, and other types of waste with trash (yard debris).

Household Garbage

- Each residence is issued one 95 gallon roll cart. Residents may request one additional roll cart for an additional fee.
- Replacement of containers will be at the expense of the resident.
- Collection is once a week. Roll carts should be place at the curb the evening prior to the scheduled collection day.
- Roll carts should not be placed on sidewalks, driveways, streets, or on the property of another.
- Holiday collection schedules are posted on the City of Camden website.

Recyclable Materials

- Each residence is issued one recycling container. Collection is on the same day as household garbage.
- Please properly prepare recyclables; see list inside. Please do not bag recyclables. Place cardboard next to bin.
- Kershaw County accepts some recyclables that the City of Camden cannot, including scrap metal, tires, used motor oil and filters, electronics and vehicle batteries. Find your nearest convenience center at kershaw.sc.gov.


Recyclable Materials Collected Curbside

- · Aluminum & steel cans
- Cardboard (no wax finish)
- Mixed paper (magazines, newspaper and inserts, catalogs, telephone books office paper, catalogs, unwanted mail; no shredded paper)
- Paperboard (cereal boxes and shoe boxes; please flatten)
- Paperboard canisters (coffee canisters, peanut containers, Pringles and similar snack containers, dough canisters)
- Plastic containers (#1 through #7; no plastic bags or wrap, loose lids or styrofoam)

Bulk Waste & White Goods

- Bulk waste and white goods up to 3 cubic yards in size may be collected from any residence a maximum of one time per month. Residents must schedule this collection by calling the city's sanitation department. Residents shall be charged 4 times the monthly sanitation fee per collection, pursuant to a schedule of rates adopted and approved by City Council, and will be billed to the residential utility account in the following billing cycle.
- Bulk waste or white goods shall be placed at the curb a maximum of 24 hours before the scheduled collection.
- The City will not collect building materials, construction debris, or electronics. If these items are found mixed with bulk waste, trash, or household garbage, the city will reject the entire collection.

Trash



- All refuse that cannot otherwise be classified as household garbage is considered trash. It includes grass clippings, leaves, shrub, tree parts smaller than 4"caliper and less than 5" feet long and similar types of yard and other natural debris.
- It excludes boxes, empty containers, scrap wood, metal, fabrics, furniture, appliances, electronics, and similar types of waste.
- It is unlawful for households and/or their employees, agents or contractors to place more than 8 cubic yards (see image above) of trash for collection by the city.
- If it becomes necessary for the city to remove and properly dispose of trash in excess of 8 cubic yards, the property owner and/or occupant shall be charged 4 times the monthly sanitation fee per occurrence, pursuant to a schedule of rates adopted and approved by City Council, and will be billed to the residential utility bill in the next utility billing cycle.
