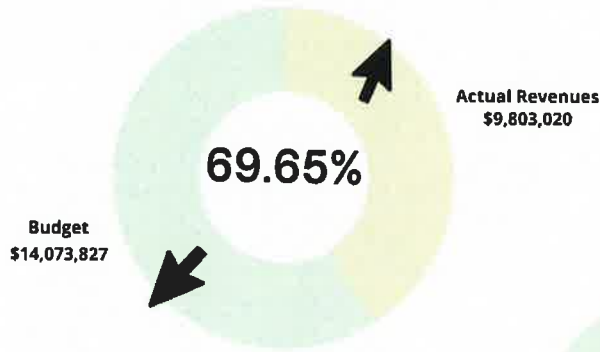

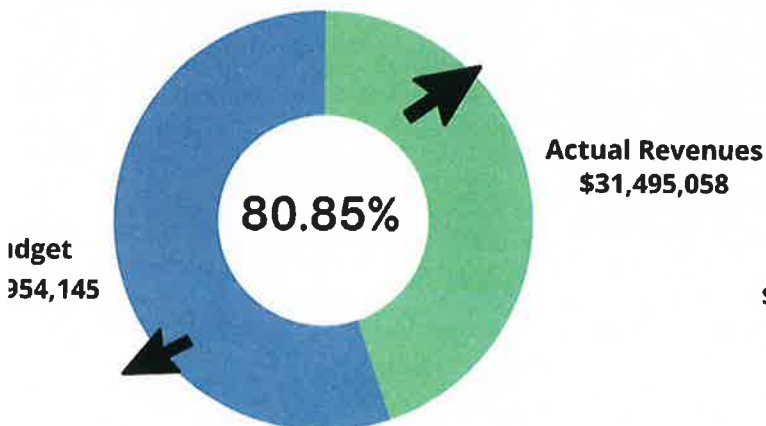


General Fund Expenses

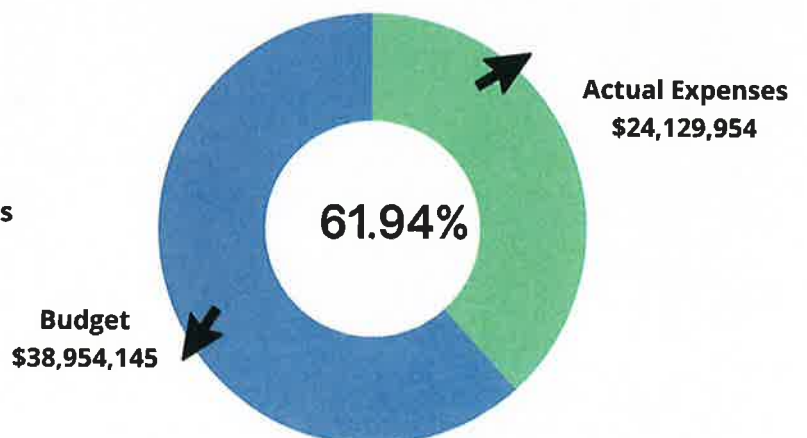

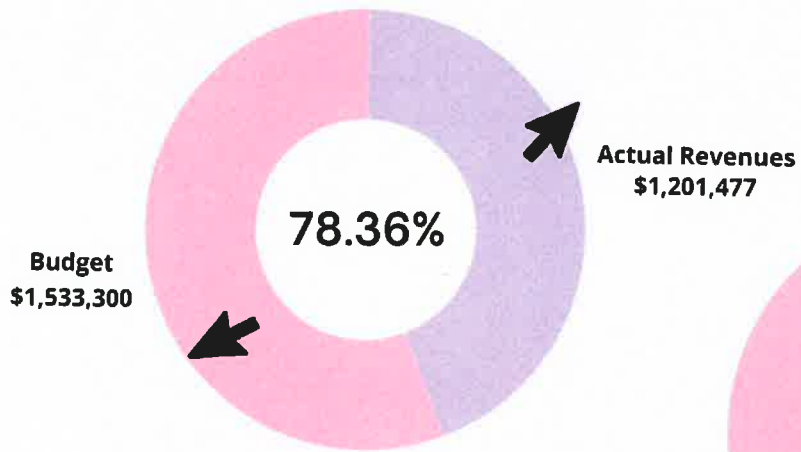


Utility Fund Expenses

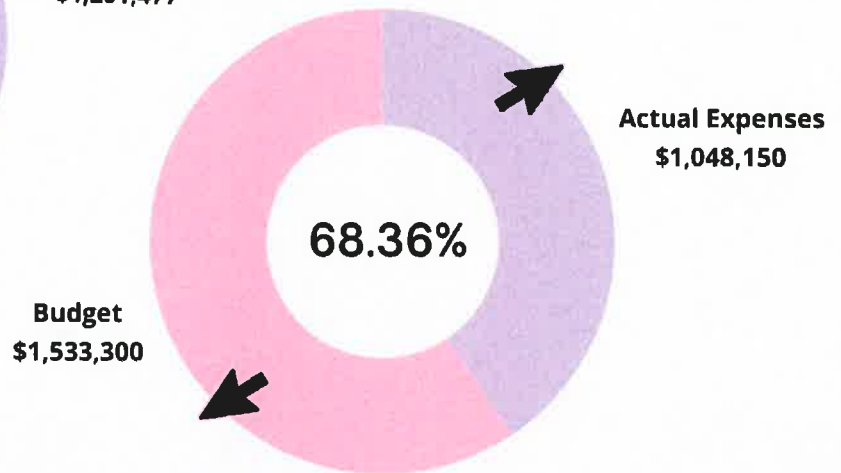

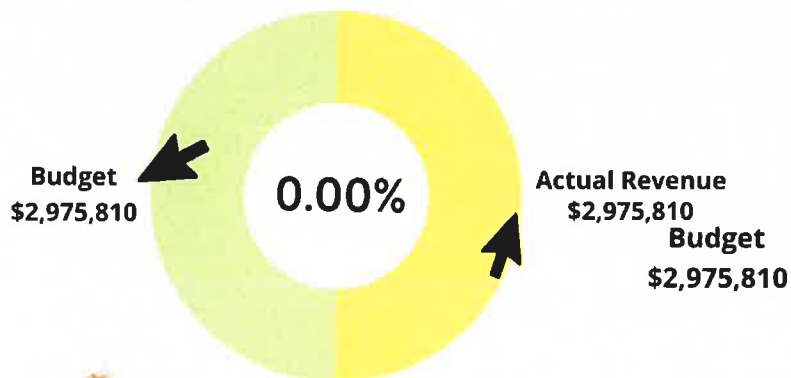
Local Tax Fund Revenues



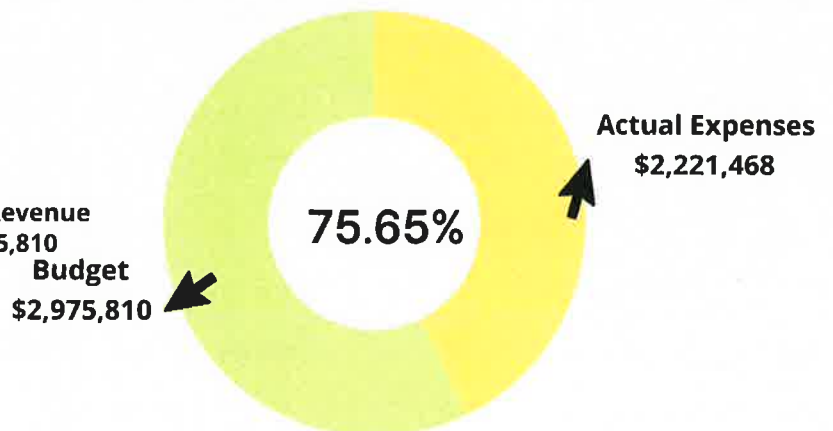
Local Tax Fund Expenses

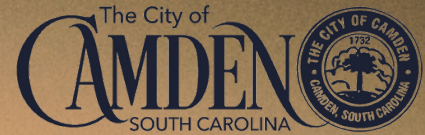

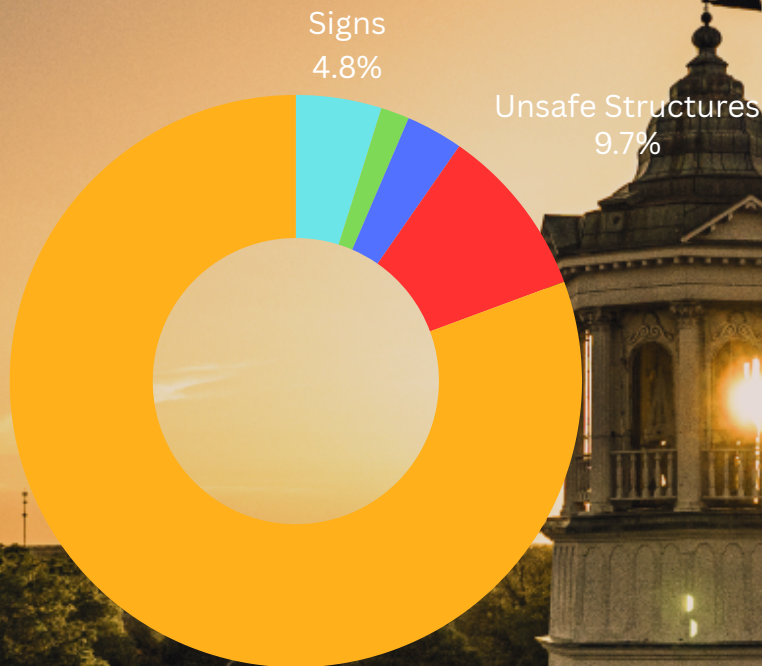

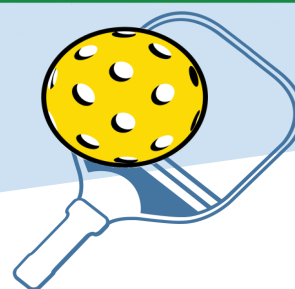


- Added 13 new members.

- Local pickleball players raised funds to erect a second shade structure next to the pickleball courts.

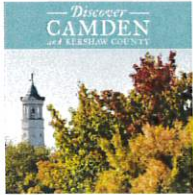

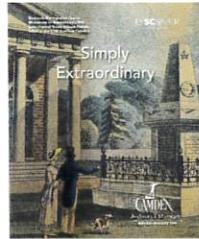
