Sanitation

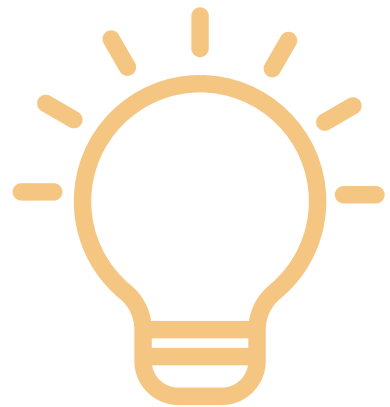
