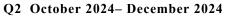

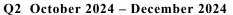


Development Impact Fees

- Municipal Facilities Impact Fee







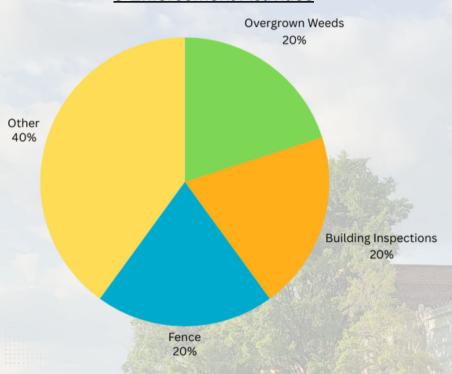

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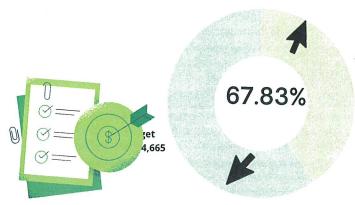




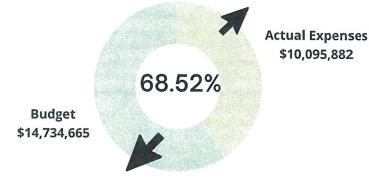

General Fund Revenues



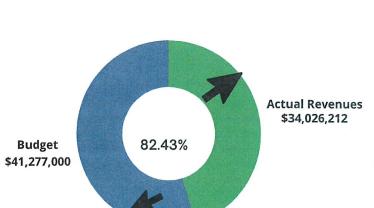
Actual Revenues \$9,994,875 General Fund Expenses



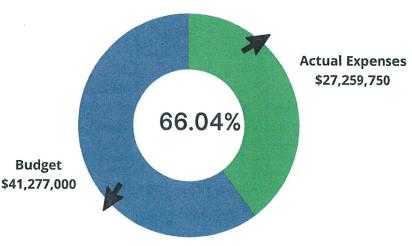

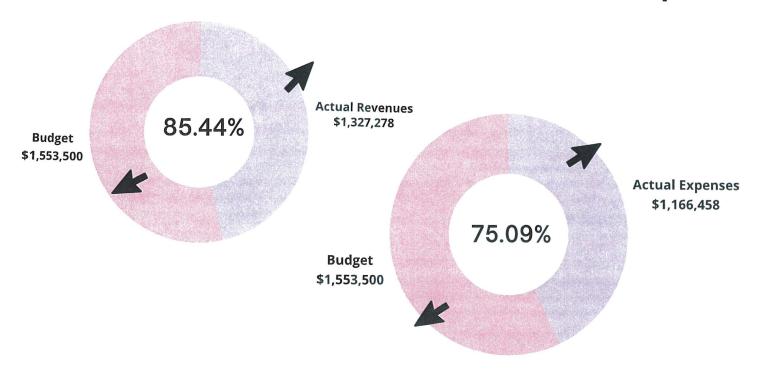

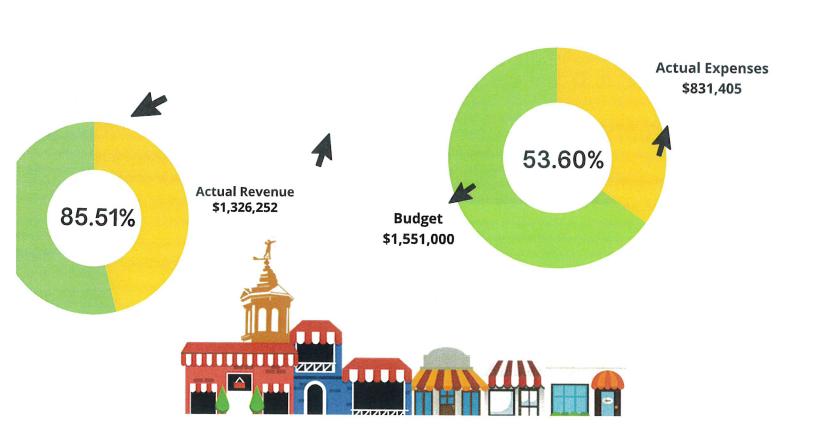
Local Tax Fund Revenues

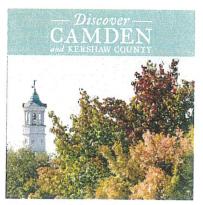
- Added 10 new members.

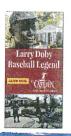
